SAINT LUCY'S DAY

The tradition of celebration for Saint Lucy's Day, also called the Feast of Saint Lucy, is a Christian feast day observed on the 13th of December. The observance commemorates Lucia of Syracuse, an early-4th-century virgin martyr who according to legend brought food and aid to Christians hiding in the Roman catacombs, wearing a candle lit wreath on her head to light her way and leave her hands free to carry as much food as possible. Her feast day, which coincided with the shortest day of the year prior to calendar reforms, is widely celebrated as a festival of light. The presence of the Santa Lucia service is considerable throughout the Anglican Communion, as well as in all Scandinavian Countries. In fact, Santa Lucia celebrations in Sweden, Norway, Finland and Denmark are nearly as well attended as Christmas Eve services. Her story captured the attention of the Scandinavian people when it was carried there by missionaries, possibly as early as the end of the Viking period. Lucia began to be celebrated in earnest in the very earliest of Christian services. Falling in Advent, it pointed to the arrival of the Light of Christ in the calendar on Christmas Day. Jesus said: "I am the light of the world: those who follow me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life: (John 8:12). May this Lucia celebration prepare us and inspire us to receive Christ and his light into our hearts this coming Christmas.
