The Creation Care Ministry Team is excited to announce that they recently applied for and received approval of their grant proposal for \$70,000 for watershed improvements from the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation. They also submitted a grant proposal for \$16,000 to the National Church for improvements to the property around the parish house.

From the Rector

Dear People of Hope -

As we continue our journey from the reflective season of Lent into the joyful celebration of Easter and into Pentecost, I am moved to share how our beloved community has grown and flourished in these past months. Since Christmas, we have seen remarkable displays of community spirit, fellowship and growth in worship. The success of our medical debt relief initiative that spanned all the churches of our two diocese has exceeded expectations. With contributions continuing through the end of Easter, our campaign directly benefited 5,695 people across our commonwealth - doubling the amount of debt we sought to relieve.

The amount topped out at \$6,089,787.16!

More than the community impact, we have advanced the Gospel of Jesus Christ by loving our



neighbors, with our neighbors. We strengthened our bonds with one another in our Central Pennsylvania - Bethlehem Diocesan family, but also extended our hands to those in need beyond our church walls. It's been a profound reminder of the power of making space for others, allowing us to truly embody the inclusive love that Christ teaches us.

In our quest to deepen connections within our church family, we have also focused on the spiritual practice of making space within our hearts and minds. *Thy Kingdom Come* launched on the feast of the Ascension, and the prayer journey we have been on has been a sanctuary for many. Praying for others in their relationship with Jesus, or asking God to deepen our own has provided quiet internal spaces for reflection and deeper communion with God. The feedback has been overwhelmingly positive, with many expressing how these sessions have enriched their prayer lives and provided much-needed solace and strength. It was really fun to be at The Church Center in NY



when Thy Kingdom Come launched. I was able to meet the Archbishop of York and our Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry, early in the day just after prayer, and then spend the remainder of the day with the good people of our church office and see their

dedication and hope for the future. We had a wonderful time!

Looking forward, let us continue to nurture these seeds of community and spirituality that have been planted. Whether through joining a ministry team at Hope, participating in our local outreach initiatives, or simply sharing a pew with a newcomer, every action we take builds up our shared sense of belonging. As your Rector, I am immensely proud of the compassion and energy you have all shown. Let's carry this momentum forward, growing ever closer to the wholesome and holy community we aspire to be.

The next Loss of Spouse session is scheduled for August 13th and the next 13-week GriefShare session will run from August 20th through November 12th, concluding with our Surviving the Holidays session on November 19th.

In our final session, we asked people to share how they felt about their experience with the program. I cannot share any specifics due to confidentiality, but I will say that our participants have shared how much these sessions have truly helped in very important ways.

We look forward to this year's Blue Christmas service and are happy to see people borrowing books from our little library.

Hope Church graciously supports this loving ministry. The diversity of the program helps to meet people where they are at in their grief and in ways specific to each individual's needs.

175th Anniversary Paraments

Hope Church is thrilled to announce the arrival of our new 175th Anniversary Vestments and Paraments, which will be unveiled on Pentecost Sunday and blessed by our Bishop.

These beautiful new additions symbolize a significant milestone in our church's history, are designed to reflect the historic 13th



century style that the Grubb family employed when building Hope Church, and will enhance the reverence of our worship services. We extend our heartfelt gratitude to the generous donors, including both congregants and clergy past and present, whose contributions during the silent phase made designing and purchasing these possible.

As we work on them over the summer, leading up to the start of our 175th year-long celebration, a dove motif will be added to one side of certain pieces. This will allow them to be used not only on Pentecost Sunday but also for other special occasions, such as the celebration of St. Luke's Day. We are especially thankful that the items arrived ahead of schedule, as we





look forward to a year of meaningful celebrations. These paraments continue the legacy of the generously donated Dissinger paraments and vestments donated in years past, and were likewise custom made by the Robert Gaspard Company.

The Brass is Back!

As we prepare for a year of celebration of our 175th Anniversary starting this October, we are thrilled to have the brass restoration complete! Just before the start of Holy Week, Dec. Nancy, Fr. Bradley and Jo Steffy took a trip over to

Property Committee

The Property Committee has been busy the last couple of months working with Vestry on some important building updates! A lot has been accomplished in addition to the trees being trimmed, grass fertilized and the parking lot being refreshed.

A new HVAC system was installed in the main floor of the Parish House with an updated propane cylinder. The hot water tank was replaced due to failure and a UV water sanitizing lamp with a water softener was installed.

In preparation for basement renovations, Jeremy Brown, Tom Brown and Rob Gokey removed the drop ceiling and Gail Edgell lightened up the walls with fresh paint.

During the recent church work day the swing set was removed to make way for the new plans that are in the works.

On the other side of the road, the concrete was repaired at the sacristy entrance to deter water intrusion in the basement and several book holders in the pews were repaired.

Laetare Golden Rose

The tradition of the golden rose is one that many may not be familiar with. For centuries, popes would present a golden rose as a gift to royals, nobles, or even cities that had demonstrated a particular character of dedication to the Faith. These golden roses were traditionally and symbolically blessed on Laetare Sunday -- the 'rose Sunday' of the Lenten season.



This year, we started this tradition at Hope Church! The first annual Laetare Golden Rose goes to Stephanie Seaman. Stephanie is a lifelong member of Hope Church, reads the Psalms for us beautifully, and is the principal communications volunteer who runs our weekly livestream.


Convocation Meal & Business Meeting
