YARN MINISTRY OF HOPE

Our ministries have flourished in beautiful ways. The Yarn Ministry has wrapped our community in tangible love and care, offering prayers and handmade creations that warm both body and spirit. This quiet yet profound ministry reflects the heart of Hope Church–faithful, compassionate, and steadfast.

OUTREACH

Hope Church has lived into its mission of loving and serving our neighbors through impactful outreach initiatives. Our food drives have provided vital support to families facing food insecurity, while *Help*, *Healing*, *and Hope* has continued to grow, offering life-changing resources to those in need. We extended our compassion beyond our local community through natural disaster relief efforts, raising funds for Episcopal Relief and Development's Hurricane Relief Fund, and supporting the vital work of the Episcopal Diocese of Jerusalem. These efforts are a testament to our commitment to being the hands and feet of Christ in the world.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

This year, we were honored to be featured in another full-length film by Sight and Sound, an extraordinary opportunity to share our story on a broader stage. Our digital ministry has also expanded, allowing us to connect with more people and extend our message of hope and faith to the wider community. FINANCES

Financially, we have made thoughtful and strategic progress. With the dedicated leadership of our new finance team, Lucy Longo and Gwen Norton, and Katie Brown's skilled support as Financial Secretary, we've partnered with the Parish Resource Center, a church-based nonprofit that augments ministry and

administrative work. Coordinating with the wisdom of the Vestry, we adjusted our annual meeting date to align with firm numbers from our trust and investment advisors. This ensures we can deliver a balanced budget with the highest degree of certainty, stewarding our resources faithfully for the future.

YOUTH AND CREATION CARE

This year marks the beginning of *To+gether*, our new youth ministry focused on forming a community rooted in the practices of the Way of Love. This vibrant initiative invites our young people to deepen their faith, connect meaningfully with one another, and discover their role in God's mission.

Our commitment to Creation Care remains steadfast. From planting pollinator-friendly gardens to participating in grant-funded projects, we continue to be leaders in environmental stewardship. We are poised to receive a record level of grant income in 2025 to support ministry areas in creation care, youth, and music.

As a special project, they also sewed Christmas stockings, which were generously filled by the congregation and donated to Teen Central, spreading joy and hope during the holiday season. The ministry was further blessed by a generous gift of nine bins of yarn from Christ Episcopal Church in Williamsport and The Rev. Kyle Murphy, providing the resources to continue their heartfelt work in the coming year.

As we reflect on the past year, we are grateful for the opportunity to serve our community and beyond through various outreach initiatives. A few notable projects from 20204 are the filled stockings we donated to Manheim Teen Central for their annual Christmas party, bringing joy to many local teens during the holiday season. Looking ahead to 2025, we are excited to continue these efforts and expand our outreach programs. A key initiative for this year will be developing a framework for all future donations that aligns with Episcopal values and the charge of Jesus to feed the hungry, clothe the poor, and help the least of these. We plan to continue initiatives already in place like our donations to the Manheim Food Bank and we look forward to new opportunities to impact our community for Christ. The Grief Ministry at Hope Church has been very successful! We will be starting our next session in February. Since the beginning of the Grief Ministry in 2023 we have had over thirty people attend one or more of our three GriefShare programs. The library has proven to be a success as I take notice of books coming and going.

I am so excited to announce that this year will bring a new, more comfortable and intimate space for the GriefShare attendees as we will be making a few additions to the larger upstairs room. People share quite private feelings in our meetings, and a quiet, private space allows people to feel safer opening up. FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

This year, Hope Episcopal Church reflects on the abundant blessings that have sustained and strengthened our ministries. Through diligent stewardship, generous giving, and collaborative efforts, we are well-positioned to meet the opportunities and challenges of 2025.

KEY BALANCES & INCOME PRODUCING TRUSTS (AS OF 1/22/25)

Our financial position remains strong, with investments and trust funds providing critical support for our mission:

Church Investments:

Building Fund: \$37,991.69

o Preservation Fund: \$451,436.90

Operating Surplus: \$39,094.43

o Total Investments: \$528,523.02

Dunlap Stohler Trust: \$3,139,430.70 - (income @5%)

Daisy E. Grubb Trust: \$122,000 - (income @5.5%)

We concluded 2024 with a solid cash position, the above resources, along with pledged and plate giving, form the financial base that enables us to fund our operations, sustain our ministries, and pursue new opportunities for growth.

2025 Summary Operating Budget Overview

The proposed budget for 2025 reflects our commitment to maintaining operational stability while advancing ministry priorities. Key highlights include:

- Operational Support: Core expenses, including clergy and staff compensation, utilities, and maintenance, are fully funded without relying on reserves.
- Expanded Ministries: Strategic investments in grant-funded initiatives ensure robust music, youth, and digital ministries without placing additional strain on church finances.
- Stewardship of Resources: Continued contributions to preservation funds and the completion of creation care projects highlight our commitment to sustainability and long-term vitality.

While the budget is balanced and forward-thinking, it relies on sustained pledge income and careful financial management to meet our goals and fund our vision.

GRANT-FUNDED INITIATIVES FOR 2025

Through Bishop Scanlan's *Shaped By Faith* initiative, we are grateful to receive funding for key ministry areas:

- Musical Ministry Expansion: \$4,000 to enhance music ministry in collaboration with St. Paul, Columbia, and St. Thomas, Lancaster.
- Youth Ministry Development: \$5,000 to support youth programming in partnership with St. John's, Lancaster, and St. Thomas, Lancaster.

Additionally, a \$17,000 Shaped By Faith grant will support digital ministry through a collaboration with St. Thomas, Lancaster, and All Saints, Hershey. While this grant is not recorded as direct income to Hope Church, we are a 1/3 beneficiary of its benefits, funding Micah Roldan's work in maintaining and expanding our online presence.

CREATION CARE PROJECTS

In 2025 Hope Church will celebrate the completion of \$50,000 worth of creation care projects, including a bio-retention swale to manage stormwater sustainably and combat erosion. These projects, generously funded through public grants, will be completed at no cost to the church and reflect our commitment to environmental stewardship.

PENDING GRANT APPLICATIONS

We have also submitted a Darlington Construction Grant application to the Diocese, requesting \$10,000 or more to reimburse property maintenance expenses. This grant, if awarded, will support the diligent efforts of the Vestry in maintaining and improving our facilities over the past year and into 2025. This would bring our total grant impact to Hope Church for 2025 (approved and pending) to about \$75,000 and counting.

LOOKING AHEAD

Our financial strategy for 2025 demonstrates faithfulness to our mission and careful stewardship of our resources. It highlights the importance of collaboration, creativity, and trust in God's provision.
